APPLICATION INFORMATION

Nominations of students may be made by teachers, guidance counselors and community members; final selections are submitted by high school principals. What we look for:

- leadership potential for serving the school and/or community
- rising high school junior or senior
- at least a "B" average
- commitment to be an active participant

Participation is not restricted by race, sex, religion or national origin. Students related to members of Rotary International are also allowed to participate in the program.

SELECTION PROCESS

Local rotary clubs will review submissions from high schools and select a limited number of club nominations.

Final selection will be made by the program executive committee. Our program goal is a minimum of 75 students.

PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION

Leadership comes from:

- leadership advisors (former participants now in college)
- professional facilitators from CCL
- leaders of Rotary District 7680

FUNDING

Each student will receive a \$400 scholarship from a local Rotary club for the entire cost of the program, including room & board. Participants will be responsible for any personal expenses and for providing their own transportation to and from the orientation session, as well as for the program itself.

EMPHASIS

We believe that participants benefit more from interaction than lecture which is why this program relies very little on idle listening and encourages action. Leadership concepts are illustrated instead through exercises, simulations, discussions and games.
