ROTARY “SEMINAR FOR TOMORROW’S LEADERS” INSINUATED

Rotary International District 7680, which encompasses 14 area North Carolina counties, has insinuated a new program called “Seminar for Tomorrow’s Leaders” for rising high school students. The program will be held at Catawba College in Salisbury July 23-26.

District Rotarians have formed a partnership with The Center for Creative Leadership, a top-ranked, global provider of education that develops better leaders. Founded in 1970 as a nonprofit, CCL helps clients around the world to cultivate creative leadership-the capacity to achieve more than imagined by thinking and acting beyond boundaries. CCL annually serves more than 20,000 individuals and 2,000 organizations.

The new program will use Catawba College’s dormitory, cafeteria, and recreational facilities. Dr. Angela Mills, a retired school administrator and Rotarian from Stanly County, will head the program for Rotary.

Each participant will be nominated by his or her high school principal, reviewed by the local Rotary Club Selection Committee, and selected by the program’s District Committee. Participation will not be restricted by race, gender, religion, or national origin.

All participants will be sponsored by local Rotary Clubs for the entire cost of the program, including room and board. Each nominee must demonstrate leadership experience, must maintain a “B” average or better in school, and must be a rising junior or senior in high school.
